### **2024 SUCCESS STORIES**

#### Long-Overdue Benefits for a San Antonio Veteran

Eduardo M. reached out to my office after struggling to get his VA benefits for more than five years.

After my office contacted the VA, he was reclassified as 100% disabled and received nearly \$200,000 in retroactive benefits.

Today, Eduardo receives full disability benefits, which help cover costs related to cancer he developed from his time in service. In 2024, my office helped San Antonio veterans get more than \$460,000 in back pay and benefits.

"I was at the end of my rope. The VA kept telling me I didn't have a case. You guys took the bull by the horns and were successful. You don't know how grateful I am." - Eduardo M.

#### Fixing Problems with Passports and Visas

Yolanda D. called my office after the State Department erroneously denied her passport application. After my office intervened, the decision was reversed and Yolanda received her passport.

"I was very upset, and I called Mr. Castro's office and immediately got assistance. They just started working on it. Mr. Castro keeps us posted, especially as seniors. He is very hands-on for everything." - **Yolanda D.**

#### Fixing IRS Issues and Helping Taxpayers

David P. reached out after the IRS mistakenly sent his tax refund to the wrong address.

After my office contacted the IRS, David received nearly \$33,000, including interest, because of the delay in payment.

In 2024, my office helped San Antonio taxpayers get nearly \$130,000 from the IRS

#### Resolving Immigration & Naturalization Issues

Stephanie C. and her husband, HK, reached out to my office after HK's application for a Green Card was denied due to paperwork errors at USCIS. After my office intervened, USCIS processed his application correctly and his case was approved.

"[Congressman Castro's office] was really helpful. They helped guide us through the information we needed to submit. Once everything was ready, they sent it out the same day and we heard from immigration two weeks after that our case was approved." - **HK**

### **INVESTING IN SAN ANTONIO**

In 2024, my office helped San Antonio organizations get nearly **six billion dollars** in grant funding, including more than ten million dollars to fund neighborhood-driven community projects.

#### Take a look at some of the funding we secured in 2024:

## \$268 million for VIA's Green Line project

Expands bus service and transportation options for nearly **54,000** passengers in San Antonio.

# \$30 million for the biggest municipal solar energy project in Texas

Funds a major solar panel installation at public facilities and a partnership with St. Philip's College to train workers for in-demand energy jobs.

## \$18 million to expand San Antonio Airport

Funds a new terminal connector that will allow passengers to move between terminals without having to re-enter airport security.

# \$6 million for Head Start programs in Bexar County

Supports approximately forty Head Start classrooms for young learners.

# \$4.6 million for CentroMed Community Health Services

Supports CentroMed's work to provide high-quality health care to **more than 121,000 patients** in the San Antonio area.

#### \$1 million to grow CPS Energy's Home Improvement Program

Funds home improvements to help 500 San Antonio homeowners qualify for no-cost, energy-saving home improvements.

### **VICTORIES FOR SAN ANTONIO**

In 2024, my office worked to expand and protect important federal programs and services in San Antonio.

## Here are some of the developments we're most proud to share:

## PROTECTING ON-TIME MAIL DELIVERY IN SOUTH TEXAS

Together with my colleagues in San Antonio's Congressional Delegation, I successfully opposed a mail centralization plan that would have delayed mail service across South Texas.

Mail delivery is a critical service, and my office will continue fighting to protect on-time delivery for all.



## DIRECT FLIGHTS FROM SAN ANTONIO TO D.C.

For years, my office has been fighting to get direct flights between San Antonio and Washington D.C.

**Starting in March**, these daily flights will save travel time for our servicemembers and support the growth of our cybersecurity sector.



## FULL RESTORATION OF MARTINEZ CREEK

Decades ago, San Antonio paved over miles of creeks to prevent flooding on the Westside.

This full ecosystem restoration, which Congress authorized in late 2024, will restore green spaces on the Westside and protect the community from future flooding.

## A NEW PASSPORT AGENCY FOR SAN ANTONIO

San Antonio is one of the largest cities in the country without a permanent passport agency.

To help travelers get their passports, my office worked with the State Department to win approval for a new San Antonio passport agency, with more details to be announced soon.

# LEGISLATIVE WINS FOR SAN ANTONIO IN WASHINGTON

Despite a difficult legislative environment, I was proud to vote for many important bills that became law in 2024, including:

- The Social Security Fairness Act, which ends restrictions that unfairly limited Social Security benefits for teachers and other public servants.
- The Veterans Compensation Cost-of-Living Adjustment Act, which increases wartime disability compensation and other benefits for veterans.
- The FAFSA Deadline Act, which makes FAFSA student aid applications available earlier in the year to help students fully understand their financial aid options for college.
- **The Debbie Smith Act**, which provides funding to state and local governments to help clear the rape kit backlog.
- The National Plan to End Parkinson's Act, which creates a national plan to prevent, diagnose, treat, and cure Parkinson's disease, and the BOLD Infrastructure for Alzheimer's Reauthorization Act, which advances Alzheimer's research and support for caregivers.









#### **CELEBRATING YOUTH ACHIEVEMENT**

#### Highlighting San Antonio's Young Artists

Every year, my office holds a Congressional Art Competition to recognize talented young artists.

In 2024, our winner was Mariela Peña, a senior at the International School of the Americas, who won first place for her piece, "Mirror of Comparison."



#### **Supporting STEM Talent**

The Congressional App Challenge allows students to showcase their tech skills through community-oriented applications.

In 2024, our winner was Neha Hariharaprasad, a freshman at Brandeis High School. Neha's app, "Eczema Ease," helps users manage and understand their eczema.


