To require investigations and reports regarding individuals who died in the custody of certain Federal authorities, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Jakelin Caal Death
- 5 in Custody Reporting Act of 2021".

## SEC. 2. INVESTIGATION AND REPORTING OF INDIVIDUALS 2 WHO DIED IN THE CUSTODY OF FEDERAL IM-3 MIGRATION ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES. 4 (a) Investigation.— 5 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 30 days after 6 the death of an alien in the custody of the Depart-7 ment of Homeland Security, the Secretary of Home-8 land Security shall conduct an investigation into 9 such death, which shall include a root cause analysis 10 that identifies any changes to policies, practices, 11 training curricula, staffing, or potential system-wide 12 errors that could reduce the probability of such an 13 event in the future. Such root cause analysis shall 14 include consultation with and input from appro-15 priately qualified personnel, who, at a minimum, 16 shall consist of a medical professional qualified in 17 any field germane to such death, and shall be per-18 formed in accordance with professional medical 19 standards for investigating sentinel events in medical 20 care facilities, including the Sentinel Event Policy 21 promulgated by The Joint Commission. 22 (2) Public availability.—Not later than 30 days after the conclusion of the investigation re-23 24 quired under paragraph (1), the Secretary of Home-25 land Security shall make publicly available on the 26 website of the Department of Homeland Security a
