A BILL

To amend the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act to clarify the career services provided to adults and dislocated workers, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Navigating to Success
5 Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. CAREER SERVICES.**

2 (a) SERVICES PROVIDED.—Subparagraph (A) of sec-
3 tion 134(e)(2) of the Workforce Innovation and Oppor-
4 tunity Act (29 U.S.C. 3174(e)(2)) is amended—

5 (1) by amending clause (iii) to read as follows:

6 “(iii) initial assessment of skill levels
7 (including literacy, digital literacy,
8 numeracy, and English language pro-
9 ficiency), competencies, abilities, current
10 applicable foreign academic and profes-
11 sional credentials, guidance and services on
12 transferring high-skilled foreign certifi-
13 cations, and supportive service needs,
14 which may include diagnostic testing and
15 use of other assessment tools;”;

16 (2) by amending clause (vi) to read as follows:

17 “(vi) provision of workforce and labor
18 market employment statistics information
19 and related skills development information,
20 including the provision of accurate infor-
21 mation relating to local, regional, and na-
22 tional labor market areas, including—

23 “(I) job vacancy listings in such
24 labor market areas;

1 “(II) information on job skills
2 and credentials necessary to obtain
3 the jobs described in subclause (I);

4 “(III) information on education
5 and skills development programs that
6 are available for attaining needed
7 skills and credentials for the jobs de-
8 scribed in subclause (I), including in-
9 formation—

10 “(aa) on the pathways to
11 such skills and credentials (in-
12 cluding information on career
13 pathway programs in the local
14 area);

15 “(bb) on the quality of such
16 education and training programs,
17 consistent with the performance
18 information provided under
19 clause (vii); and

20 “(cc) on the comparability of
21 current foreign academic and
22 professional certifications to
23 needed skills and credentials; and

24 “(IV) information relating to
25 local occupations in demand and the

1 earnings, skill requirements, and op-
2 portunities for advancement for such
3 occupations;”;

4 (3) by amending clause (xi) to read as follows:

5 “(xi) assistance in identifying and es-
6 tablishing eligibility for programs of finan-
7 cial aid assistance for training and edu-
8 cation programs that are not funded under
9 this Act, including Federal financial aid
10 under title IV of the Higher Education Act
11 of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1070 et seq.) and
12 through State-funded education and train-
13 ing programs;” and

14 (4) in clause (xii), by striking subclauses (IV)
15 through (XI) and inserting the following:

16 “(IV) individual counseling, in-
17 cluding career counseling;

18 “(V) career planning; or

19 “(VI) assessment and develop-
20 ment of employability skills, including
21 development of learning skills, com-
22 munication skills, interviewing skills,
23 punctuality, and professional conduct,
24 to prepare individuals for unsub-
25 sidized employment or training; and”.

1 (b) DELIVERY OF SERVICES.—Subparagraph (C) of
2 section 134(c)(2) of the Workforce Innovation and Oppor-
3 tunity Act (29 U.S.C. 3174(c)(2)) is amended by inserting
4 “or community-based organizations to serve individuals
5 with barriers to employment,” after “nonprofit service
6 providers,”.
