INTERNSHIP PROGRAM INFORMATION

The Office of Congressman Joaquin Castro offers internships at its Washington, D.C. and San Antonio, Texas offices. The internship program is designed to provide students with an opportunity to learn about the legislative process and/or constituents services.

Internship Positions Available: In the Washington DC office, interns' responsibilities will vary. They will be asked to answer phones, run errands, research legislation for the Member and legislative staff, attend hearings and briefings and answer constituent letters on various issues before the House. As a result, interns learn about the legislative process and the many other functions of a congressional office.

In the San Antonio office, interns may be asked to do a variety of things, including day-to-day office work such as answering phones, writing letters, and assisting with research. In addition, interns may be assigned to assist with constituent casework or work on district-based projects of importance.

Eligibility: A candidate must be a graduate student, undergraduate student, or has recently graduated

General Information: Internships are paid \$15 an hour. Interns are expected to work between 20 and 40 hours a week during an 8 to 12-week internship period. Internships are offered during the fall, spring, or summer semesters. The hours are flexible to accommodate students' hectic course schedules, but generally run from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Interns may receive academic credit if an agreement is made between the Office of Congressman Joaquin Castro and the intern's college or university. All interns are subject to applicable rules of the U.S. House of Representatives, including the Code of Official Conduct, and the policies and procedures of the Office of Congressman Joaquin Castro.

Application Procedures: Candidates must complete an application form and submit it with their cover letter, resume, and two-page writing sample. All application items must be submitted as a complete package. Incomplete applications will not be reviewed.

Application Deadlines:

Summer program: applications must be submitted by - March 21st

Fall program: applications must be submitted by - July 25th

Winter/Spring program: applications must be submitted by - November 14th
