By discontinuing this ceremony at Fort Sam Houston National Cemetery, we fail to adequately honor their legacy and diminish the significance of those hallowed grounds.

While we recognize there may be challenges with organizing such an event at two separate National Cemeteries in San Antonio—as is currently the case— we do not believe these challenges are insurmountable, and they are certainly worth overcoming. "Military City, USA" boasts a uniquely large population of veteran families. Providing them with more than one option to honor their loved ones on Veterans Day is not only fitting, but it keeps in line with efforts at the VA to improve accessibility.

In closing, we emphasize that the Veterans Day ceremony at Fort Sam Houston National Cemetery is a cherished event, not just for those directly involved, but for the entire South Texas community. We are committed to working with you, the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, and other relevant stakeholders to explore every possible avenue to uphold such an important tradition at this site. Thank you for your consideration of this critical matter.
